PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE... Mission Trip to Wayland Kentucky At the end of May I was able to go with other people from the Oley Cluster on a mission trip to Ken-tucky. Trinity Lutheran in Bechtelsville and St. Paul's in Douglassville were the two churches in the cluster that went on the trip. They let me tag along. We drove 10 hours to Prestonsburg Kentucky on Monday to our lodging location to the Presbyterian Church in town. The group from the Oley Cluster included 8 people and when we got to the church, another group of 7 from North Carolina shared the church with us. Tuesday morning we were up and out the door at 7:00 am and had to drive 25 minutes to the work site in Wayland. The small town of Wayland, about 400 residents, was destroyed by a flood in 2022. 45 people died in that flood and hundreds lost their homes. The Appalachia Service Project secured land on higher ground from the local fire company and built 12 homes there. By the end of this June, all of the homes will be turned over to the new homeowners that lost everything in the flood. A contractor was hired by ASP and that company was in charge of building the homes along with the help of volunteers. Not an easy job for anyone who has to manage his contractor company and work with skilled and unskilled volunteers. Since I am an unskilled worker my jobs the first two days included painting the fountains of two homes with three coats of paint. I though thow hard can painting be? Well, not easy in 89 degree heat; as well as reaching 2 feet below the ground level to get to the concrete slab. The next two days were spent painting the interior of one entire home and half of another home. The skilled workers from our group completed 3 handicap ramps attached to a porch in the back of the home. I did have one mishap. I went out the back porch to take a break and I woke up an hour later. No one knew where I was and I now have the nickname of "porch" take a break and I woke up an hour later. We really had no contact with the people that will be living in those homes which was disappointing but we did all sign a Bible that we left in the home. In the Bible we wrote one of our favorite bible verses. I picked Ephesians 2:10, *"For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do"* I just love that verse and the last 9 words have had a huge impact on me. God knew what good works I was going to do before I even thought about it. We also picked a verse from the Bible and wrote it on a piece of paper and we put those verses from 15 of us that worked together to help finish those homes in a jar. I picked Numbers 6:24-26, something we all hear at the end of worship every Sunday. *"The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; the LORD turn his face toward you and give you peace."* Saturday morning we left for home at 6:00 am and returned home by 4:00 pm. As I look back on my ex-perience, I am glad that I took the opportunity to do a mission trip, which I had always wanted to do ever since I saw Habitat for Humanity. I am pretty sure if I am given the chance again that I will go again. I won-der who else from Christ Lutheran would like to go along?

FROM THE PASTOR...

"The Fellowship of the Believers"

As we prepare for the Summer months and I look back at our worship attendance and the monthly income from the last six months it causes me to pause. Many of our folk have gotten out of the practice of coming to worship on a regular basis. We also have found that with all the programs and projects, there is much to do and often it is difficult to find those ready and willing to do the ministry of the church. Why is that? Are we a church of committed followers of Christ, ready to do what Christ asks and ready to go where Christ points us?

The following article addresses this issue and a problem that appears to be common in many churches. Please consider its message carefully as we continue the work of our Shared Ministry throughout the coming months.

"Religious Hitchhikers"

"Church attendance is infected with a malaise of conditional loyalty which has produced an army of ecclesiastical hitchhikers. The hitchhiker's thumb says, "You buy the car, pay for repairs and upkeep and insurance, fill the car with gas -- and I'll ride with you. But if you have an accident, you are on your own! And I'll probably sue."

So, it is with the credo of so many of church attendees: "You go to the meetings and serve on the boards and committees, you grapple with the issues and do the work for the church and pay the bills -- and I'll come along for the ride. But if things do not suit me or get difficult or the commitment level gets to be too much, I'll criticize and complain and probably bail out. My thumb is always out for a better ride."
